Here's how the forwarding email address works: when a message is sent to your @eastwestcommunity.org address, that message will be forwarded to a personal email address you select. If you change your personal email address in the future, you can easily update it here so that emails sent to your @eastwestcommunity.org address will automatically be forwarded to your new personal email address. Your @eastwestcommunity.org email address that you give out to colleagues and friends will remain the same.
